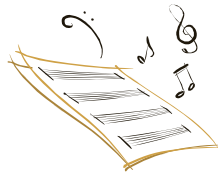

The death of a parent is a turning point in the emotional, personal, and social lives of most adults. It initiates a time of substantial change and redirection in the way we view ourselves, our relationships to others, and our place in the world. It has consequences for the dynamics in families.

Yet friends, coworkers, and even relatives often minimize the extent of loss felt by adults following a parent's death. They may expect the bereaved to quickly recover and emerge largely unchanged from the loss. The truth is that the death of a parent often launches a period of self-reflection and the transformation of adult identity. Even individuals in their 50's, 60's, and beyond report feeling abandoned or orphaned when a parent dies -- even when the loss is anticipated. (Umberson, Debra. *Death of a Parent: Transition to a New Adult Identity*, Cambridge University Press, 2003).

If you have lost a parent and are dealing with the transition it brings, you can request a Befriender to be a companion on your journey. Befrienders provide a listening presence that is respectful and nonjudgmental. To request a Befriender or to find out more about Befriender Ministry, call the parish office at 734-878-3161.

### STEWARDSHIP CORNER - 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of Easter

The disciples in today's Gospel came to know Jesus in the breaking of the bread. When we share what we have with those who are in need, we too, will discover Jesus in our midst.

Jesus says to all of us, "Peace be with you." His IS a peace that passes all understanding. How can one truly comprehend the miracle of the Lord overcoming death and sin with new life and resurrection? How can we wrap our minds around the reality that the Lord appeared to His disciples after the crucifixion, stood among them, allowed them to touch His wounds, and shared food with them? It is a leap of faith. That is what is required of us all. To Believe. Jesus is Lord now and forever. He is the ruler of our world and the true authority over us all.
