## MINISTRY NOTES MUSIC

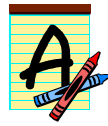
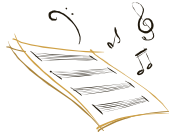
### The Cost of Commitment

All across the country musicians and liturgy planners try faithfully to use their gifts for the building of the kingdom. It's not easy. Those for whom this ministry is a life-giving vocation suffer much to be faithful to it. I heard a story of a musician who had to move out of her office so that old file cabinets could be stored in there, and of a pastor whose entire choir walked out because he asked them to sing facing the assembly. I know of a fine pastoral musician who has been asked not to sing because his voice is "too beautiful." I know priests who have to go away to recuperate from exhaustion because of the priest shortage. No, it's not easy. And it's not getting any easier.

On the other hand, there's a lot of good news. Some folks tell me they love their parish, their pastor, their people, their musicians. Choirs that consisted of only two or three persons five years ago are full of life, energy, and more members today. More and more musicians are being paid a decent salary. Musicians tell me that finally, after all these years, "Father" understands what they're saying. (Perhaps the musician is speaking more clearly.)

And so it goes. Ups and downs...but never boring. Let's take a moment to reflect on the good things that continue to happen. We have much to be thankful for: life, breath, music, health, community, church, musicians, and love. We've got running water and nobody's shooting at us when we wake up. That's more than a lot of people on this planet can say. Don't let a day pass without looking for that "good thing."

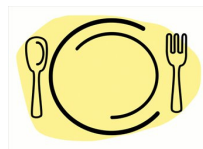
